Frequently Asked Questions

What is iPass?

iPass is Norwood Public School's student information system. The district uses iPass for student demographics, attendance, storing grades, scheduling and more.

What is iPass/iParent?

iParent is a feature of the iPass student information system that provides parents access to schedules, term grades, progress reports and attendance records in an effort to facilitate and improve communication between home and school.

How do I access iParent?

You may access iPass/iParent from any computer with an internet connection by launching your web browser and going to the Norwood Public Schools' web site <http://www.norwood.k12.ma.us>. The link to iPass/iParent is under the section *For Parents*.

Who may access iParent?

Norwood Public School parents/guardians who have applied for a username and password may access iParent. If you have questions about your username and password or accessing the system please email iparenthelp@norwood.k12.ma.us

What do I do after I get to the main page?

There are menus on the left hand side. Click the + (plus) sign on the left of iParent to expand the menus.

What may I reasonably expect from iPass/iParent as a parent?

Parents will be able to check their child's schedule, daily attendance, mid-term progress reports and end of term report cards. Our goal is to begin with these modules and make them available to all classes. Additional modules will be phased in once the entire school has registered and iPass training has been delivered to key staff.

This system is intended to improve communication between home and school and it should not be used as a vehicle to create an adversarial or challenging relationship between parent and teacher. Questions and comments sent over email should be informational only and not excessive in length. This system is not intended to remove the responsibility of the student to be responsible and accountable for his/her work. Issues and/or questions that are personal in nature should be handled by meeting with the teachers personally.
